# Questions...an example – Religion and Life

- 1. What is meant by the term sanctity of life:
  - [a] Life is sacred and given by God
  - [b] Life should be good quality
  - [c] Humans should be able to choose when they die
  - [d] When we die we shouldn't be able to choose
- 2. Give two examples of what religious believers might do to help the environment. (2)
- 3. Explain two contrasting beliefs in contemporary British society about euthanasia. (In your answer you should refer to the main religious tradition of Great Britain and one or more other religious traditions.) (4)
- 4. Explain two religious beliefs about caring for the planet. Refer to scripture or sacred writings in your answer. (5)
- 5. "Scientific views and religious are not compatible about the creation of the universe." Evaluate this statement. (12)

# Revision
