

# Science mock exams 2022



Each student will sit three exams. For Trilogy Science students each exam will be 1 hour 15 minutes and worth 75 marks. The marks from each exam is added together to give a total which will then be used to give a grade. Trilogy Science students will get two Science grades. These can be different or the same (e.g. 44, 56, 34 etc.). For Triple Science students each exam will be 1 hour 45 minutes and worth 100 marks. A grade for each Science subject will be given.

Students should refer to the topic list in order to know which topics they need to revise.

The exams will have a range of different style questions. Most commonly this includes:

- Multiple choice questions
- Give questions – state/ write down something. No description or explanation is needed.
- Describe questions - write about what you can see/what you would do/what happens. You don't need to give a reason why.
- Explain questions - give a reason why.
- Suggest questions – suggest means explain.
- Compare questions - write about similarities and differences. These questions might ask you to compare advantages/disadvantages or to compare data from a table/graph.
- Describing graphs/data questions - write about how the numbers/columns/lines change.
- Looking up equation questions - look up an equation on your equation sheet that has the things from the question in it and write it down!
- Calculation questions - where you must use an equation to work something out.
- Multi equation calculation questions - questions where you will need to use 2 different equations to work out an answer.

In school revision will be offered by the Science department on Thursdays:

- Breakfast clubs – every Thursday in M16 from 8am with either Mr Wood or Mrs Webster
- After school revision – every Thursday in the Science classrooms with different teachers each week.

What is the best way to prepare?

- Revise all three sciences from the beginning.
- Use your topic lists so you know you are revising the right stuff.
- Come to breakfast club and after school revision.
- Use revision strategies that work:
  - Make flash cards
  - Make mind maps
  - Make condensed notes
  - Past papers/exam questions
- Practice, practice, and more practice – keep revising a topic until you know it without having to look anything up!
- Speak to Mr Wood/your class teacher if you are struggling or want extra things from us (past papers/exam questions/revision packs).
