


The Newfield Pledge Achievement Leads to Opportunity and Choice

Our commitment to our students and families

All students will benefit from a culture of safety, happiness and success and a broad and balanced curriculum delivered by quality first teaching that includes excellent preparation for life beyond Newfield School.

In addition, students at Newfield School will have the following offer:

- A comprehensive transition to Newfield School from primary school that includes Y7 only days
- A commitment to the wider curriculum that leads to the Newfield School Diploma, a 2-year programme that leads to graduation at the end of Y8
- The Y9 Aspiration programme based on a tailored careers curriculum and introduction to the Duke of Edinburgh Award
- A 5 year careers programme to inform and raise aspiration to fully prepare students for further lifelong learning
- A reading programme that exposes all students to high quality literature and is linked to our personal development curriculum
- Opportunity for all students to explore the local area and beyond through a series of trips and visits including residential visits
- All students will be part of 'change for good' either through their charitable contribution or commitment to environmental sustainability
- All students will be expected to take an active role in their wider learning and experience including public speaking, taking part in team sports, understanding democracy and the current political landscape
- All students will take part in the creative arts and technology (music, drama, art, product design, food technology) throughout KS3 and the option to continue with these in KS4
- Celebration events every year as well as key social events such as the Y11 Christmas Ball (where all students learn traditional ballroom dances)
